Thank you for your letter of 22 January 1980 regarding the stock of approximately 2,000 Jersey Crowns you hold and wish to destroy.

The Royal Mint has already taken the view that it is unlikely that any Jubilee Crowns can now be sold and have therefore taken the decision to melt down any residual stocks. I see no reason why Jersey could not take the same action. A stock of 2,000 coins would yield 1,683.745 ounces of fine silver. Should you require the Royal Mint to have the coins melted down and refined on your behalf we would pay the bullion price ruling on the day the coins are received in the Royal Mint less the refiners charge of approximately £65 for a quantity of 2,000 coins and a destruction cost of approximately £175. Both figures exclude VAT. The destruction cost cover the Royal Mint's charge for defacing the coins before they are issued to the refiner. The alternative is for the Royal Mint to arrange for someone to visit the refiner and oversee the refining process. This is unlikely to save very much on the cost. You may feel that this destruction charge is unnecessary but it would be normal for the Royal Mint wither to deface coins before being issued to refiners or to arrange for a member of the Royal Mint staff to oversee the refining process.

You can assess the value of the coins by multiplying the fine silver figures quoted with the daily rates quoted on the London Market for silver. The rate quoted for the 29 January is £16.43 giving an assessed value of the content of 2,000 coins of £27,663.93. This figure will obviously vary according to the price ruling on the day the coins are surrendered for destruction.

Thank you for your letter of the 5th February regarding an up to date statement of the Silver Jubilee Crowns. I have asked that the up to date statement be prepared and I hope to be able to forward this to you by the end of February.

Regarding your enquiry about the estimated costs or promotion and fulfilment shown in the last statement, I would stress that until the exercise has been completed this item is only an estimate. For your information the major items under this head are in the discounts offered to dealers to take bulk quantities, the cost of press advertising in both the national and numismatic press, and the cost of packing and posting individual items to collectors throughout the World. It is usual to base the interim statement on the estimation given at the outset i.e., £3 per item sold until the actual costs are known and can be apportioned to the various projects advertised at the same time.

At this point in time it appears that expenditure will be less than £3 per coin. When the final statement is drawn up the actual cost will be charged and any additional profit paid to the Treasury.



Further to your memo of 22 February and your interim statement of account as at 31 December 1977, I would confirm the payment of the net amount due to the Treasury of £72779.08 will be made within the next few days. There are a number of points that I wish to make however in connection with the interim statement, as follows:-

- i) The quantities quoted as sales up to 31 December 1977 have not been agreed by the Accounts Section. In respect of both proof and uncirculated coins, the quantity sold according to our records up to 31 December 1977 are below the quantity stated in your interim statement. However, the sales in Period 10 (8.1.78. to 4.2.78.) have been sufficient to increase our record of sales to 34.12.77. above that shown in your interim statement (43.1.12.1)
- ii) It has been noted that in accordance with works order number 88 (amended 7.10.77.) 150,000 uncs and 10,000 proofs were despatched to Jersey. Invoice L1438 has been raised in respect of the 150,000 uncs, but no invoicing instruction has yet been received for the 10,000 proofs.
- iii) A memo from yourself to Mr Unwin dated 24.8.77. instructed the despatch and invoicing of a further 5,000 uncs. To date there has been no invoice instruction received in respect of these additional uncirculated coins. Further to your letter of 24th August to Mr. Hart, I have pleasure in enclosing an interim statement of account for the Silver Jubilee commemorative coins sold by the Royal Mint on behalf of Jersey. I apologise for the fact that we did not send you an interim statement earlier as indicated in our letter of 15th August, apparently this was overlooked.

The statement enclosed with this letter reflects completed sales, that is money which has been received and coins despatched, but does not take account of unfulfilled orders. The figure for promotion and fulfilment is an estimated figure to the end of December and will be adjusted in a final statement when all invoices have been received and coins despatched; I expect to be able to send a final statement by the 31st March.

Invoices are being prepared for the cupro-nickel uncirculated and silver proof Jubilee crowns that were issued directly to the States Treasury and these invoices will be despatched shortly.

Please let me know whether a cheque in respect of the £72,779.08, that is the net amount due to the Treasury up to 31st December, 1977, should be forwarded to the States Treasury.

As you probably know, the Royal Mint produces proof sets of United Kingdom base metal coins and sells these to collectors both in the United Kingdom and throughout the rest of the world. These base metal proof sets have been put on sale by the Royal Mint each year since 1970 and substantial sales have been made. In addition we are offering to sell sets of base metal proof coins of the same design as coins in circulation on behalf of other customers and sales of up to 20,000 sets per issue seem likely. We would be pleased if Jersey would permit the Royal Mint to offer base metal sets of your coins to collectors throughout the world.

I am enclosing a memorandum on this subject and would be grateful if you would let us have your reactions to this proposal after you have had an opportunity to study it.

Memorandum on the Sale of Base Metal Proof Sets on behalf of the Jersey States Treasury

General

Our proposals are that base metal proof sets consisting of six coins, that is 50p, 10p, 5p, 2p, 1p and ½p, of the same design as the circulation coins dated 1978, packed in an acrylic case, together with an insert to hold the coins and an outer paper wrapper, be sold to collectors in the United Kingdom and other countries throughout the world. The colour of the insert and wrapper, as well as the layout of the coins, would be agreed with the States Treasury before issue. Apart from providing useful income to the Treasury the issue of sets will publicise the Island of Jersey and thereby stimulate tourism.

Demand in Jersey for Sets

Sets of these coins could be provided at a price of £5.00 each (1978 issues only) to the States Treasury for distribution in Jersey only, to be sold at a price to the public of not less than £10.50 each.

Harketing Methods

The following methods of distributing sets would be employed:-

- (1) By advertising in the National Press and Numismatic publications.
- (2) By direct mailing of literature to previous buyers of Royal Mint collectors coins and other potential purchasers. Lists of previous buyers are extensive and promotional literature invites collectors to apply for coins direct to one of our sales offices or one of our agents. The orders are then fulfilled by mail.
- (3) By special promotional exercises.
- (4) By supplying in bulk to agents and dealers who themselves advertise, promote and mail to prospective purchasers in addition to operating wholesale and retail businesses. Sales of coins through agents and dealers are normally arranged by allowing discounts.

Selling Price

The selling price of a base metal set would be considered at the time of issue and agreed in advance with the States Treasury but based on current price levels a price of £10.50 per set would seem appropriate.

Minting Limit and Numbers

In order to stimulate sales we suggest a limit of a maximum number of proof sets that will be issued be announced before sales start. The minting limit suggested for Jersey proof sets is 25,000 to include sets for local distribution (we have assumed Jersey would require say 5,000 sets for local distribution).

Timing []

Timing of the issue would be agreed with the States Treasury. Providing a decision in principle is agreed shortly it would be possible to have proof sets available for distribution between the second half of 1978 and mid 1979.

Income to the States Treasury

The method of sale would be similar to that adopted for sales of the Jersey Silver Jubilee Crown, that is the States Treasury would be charged for any sets distributed in Jersey. The cost of sets sold to collectors in the United Kingdom and other countries throughout the world would be set against income. A management fee of 10% of the gross profits would be charged as a contribution to management costs. An estimate of the income that might be derived by the States Treasury from sales is given below:-

Thank you for your letter of 15th August. I look forward to receiving a statement showing sales, income and expenditure appertaining to the Silver Jubilee crown sometime in September.

I have also been approached recently by a bank in the Island to supply 5,000 cupro-nickel Jersey Silver Jubilee crowns to one of its customers. The bank has made enquiries through its head office in England regarding the supply of these crowns since our own stock in the Island is exhausted but has been referred back to the States Treasury with a suggestion that we may be able to arrange for a minting of this quantity. We were talking the other day about your possible need of more cupro-nickel coins.

For a long time there appeared to be a bottomless pool of blanks we could draw upon to strike additional coin requirements.

You should know that the reservoir has dried up and if you want more coins there are two points to be considered.

- 1. Economics of production; our Factory would always be willing to strike say 5,000 coins or even less if blanks were available, in order to use them up, but if we have to make or order new blanks a viable quantity would probably be much greater than 5,000. We would need to-discuss with Production Division.
- 2. There is a several week lead-time for blank procurement.



Kr. Lotherington asked me to reply to your letter of 1 July regarding sales of the Jersey Jubilee Crown.

I hope to send you an interim statement of account in about 10 days time but meanthile I am sure you will be pleased to learn that our experience is similar to yours and, if one can judge the commercial success of the coin issue by the present state of the order book, the proof coin issue will be a sell-out and sales of the cupro-nickel version should be in the region of 100,000 pieces. The proof version is fully subscribed and to date we have received orders from dealers for 73,000 cupro-nickel coins.

We are not yet in a position to fulfil all orders and there is always the possibility of cancellation by over optimistic declers, that is why I would ask you to treat the figures with caution until you receive statements from us. These statements will reflect only those orders actually fulfilled, as unfulfilled orders carry an element of risk in terms of actual income.

We note that you have under consideration a further small order for the cupronickel version and if you could let me know your decision very soon manufacture could be combined with a second batch required by our Marketing Branch.

50p and 10p coins are indeed produced at lower cost with a greater margin of seignorage to the Issuing Authority due to a number of factors, the most relevant being that the crown, or 25p coin, is very large and heavy in relation to its face value and metal and manufacturing costs per thousand pieces are considerably higher than the metal and work content in 50p and 10p coins. The 25p coin is in its present form totally unacceptable as an ordinary circulation coin and it would be necessary to adopt a different specification if one were seriously considering a 25p coin for general use. It is essentially and, for many years now, traditionally a commemorative coin and for this reason it is perhaps unfair to compare its cost with that of our ordinary circulation coins.



There are other reasons for the relatively high cost of the crown and I will go into them if you wish me to but the dominant factor is outlined above.

The you for your kind observations about our own crown and we are glad that you is has not with the same sort of success.

I will let you have a statement of account as soon as possible and please let me know soon if you want more cupro-nickel crosms.

I sent sketches of your ordinary circulation coins to you on 30 June showing alternative ways of deleting the word "NEK" from the inscription. We have not heard from you on this matter and I cannot help wondering if the sketches have gone astray.

I expect you will be in the process of calculating the sums due to the States Treasury in respect of the Jersey Silver Jubilee crown sales since, when we spoke about this matter several months ago, I think you expressed the view that remittances would probably be on a quarterly basis and I am certainly interested to know whether your experience reflects ours in Jersey.

You will, I am sure, be delighted to hear that the entire 150,000 cupro nickel crowns have been sold in a matter of two months. The silver proof crowns put on sale only five weeks ago are already more than half sold out and this with no advertising at all.

Some thought is being given to restriking the cupro nickels but I am not entirely sure that the margins involved are worthwhile a small reminting. The basic price of 15p for the coin, when added to the overheads involved, leaves such a small surplus that I think the Finance & Economics Committee will decide to leave matters as they now stand. Indeed, a much more profitable issue will be the reminting of the normal Island coinage since I see from your letter to Mr. Clennett that 50p and 10p cpins are so much more economic to produce than the 25p coin. Is there any particular reason for this?

I note from items in the press that your own crown is in very heavy demand and am very pleased that after all the hard work involved it has become such a very successful issue as ours has.



In your letter dated 17 March, you had enquired whether there would be scope for your taking more than the 10,000 proof crowns should your allocation sell better than originally anticipated. We had delayed replying pending an overall view of Bureau sales and bulk reservations from our Agents. There has been a tremendous interest here in the Jubilee and all proof coins, including the Jersey, have been selling extremely well. We anticipate no problem in selling our 25,000 proofs and its likely to be completed shortly. The short answer is therefore that it might be difficult to increase your 10,000 proofs should more be wanted at a later date. Perhaps you could let me know how your own sales are now going and whether we ought to see whether any more might be reserved for you.

We were not able to complete the packing of the 10,000 proofs as we ran short of suitable capsules. 

Dear Mr. Lotherington,

Returning from leave I found the sample of the Silver Jubilee crown packed in its presentation case awaiting me. Thank you very much for the coin which is of excellent quality. I note your point about the white film close to the edge of the plastic capsule and am referring the matter to Algram Plastics Ltd., the manufacturers. A check of the capsules in the Jersey Treasury (we are supplying the cupro-nickel crown complete in a similar capsule) suggests that the incidence of the film is only occasional. I do not think that anyone is likely to attribute to the Royal Mint any lack of quality in the coin production because of the film at the extreme edge of some of the capsules. In fact, our experience has been that collectors of proof coins prefer to store them out of the capsule rather than in it; this was one of the reasons why we opted for a very thin capsule rather than the larger more rigid type which you are issuing and which requires a larger well in the presentation case.

In any event the quality of the crown I am confident will ensure the complete success of the issue.

A request has been received from a company trading as Wessex Numismatics that you be authorised to release to them photographs of the designs of the Jersey crown for an advertisement purpose. The company is run, I believe, by a Mr. J.C. Ekes, and has purchased Jersey coinage over many years and there is no objection to you releasing to him the necessary photographs and any other material required for the company's catalogue purpose.

I note that packing of the crowns is now in progress and look forward to seeing the first shipment arrive in the near future. For your information

we are provisionally fixing the 17th May as issue day for the proof silver crown. The cupro-nickel crown has been well received locally and a number of compliments have been passed on its quality.



I attach for your information anup-dated production time-table for the first batch of coins for marketing. You will see that the earliest we can now hope to have all six coins is the end of August. This assumes that we have a satisfactory sample of the Tristan da Cunha proof from BMP within the next week and that they then commence deliveries at the rate of 3,000 coins per week 6 weeks thereafter. Although this is the planning basis, there must be considered doubt whether it can, in fact, be achieved owing to EMP's poor performance to date on proof coins. It is only in the last few days that the Tuvalu proof coins have been coming through to us in any quantity, and we have now, in fact, received 3,000 of the 5,000 in batch one. This has taken them 4 months since they completed the Kuwait order. Satisfactory samples of the Tuvalu gold coin are still awaited.

It is obviously very important that these orders be progressed, and I am copying this memo to Mr Lotherington who normally deals direct with the Birmingham Mint.

I am pleased to inform you that the Finance & Economics Committee at its meeting yesterday examined and were very pleased with the quality of the proof silver Jersey crown.

There seems to be a great deal of interest for the coin here and I am pleased to sae that the supplies will begin to arrive towards the end of April and the delivery completed in May. If the demand within the Island exceeds our expectations and the whole of our share of the issue was taken up swiftly, would it be possible to draw further supplies of the silver proof crown from your 25,000? Clearly if you have good demand for your share one would not wish to place you in any difficulties in fulfilling orders and it may well be that local interest will not in fact generate the demand to take up all our 10,000 pieces, but I felt this might be a useful opportunity to raise the point in principle.

With reference to our telephone conversation earlier this week concerning the delivery of the cupro-nickel coins, we have provisionally fixed the 4th April as issue date. With this in mind, I shall be grateful if you could say by what means the coins will be despatched to Jersey and when since it appeared the total quantity ordered have now been struck and it is only the packing and despatch that remained to be done at the time we spoke. I appreciate that the sheer volume of the quantity ordered makes packing and despatch no short or easy task and I do not under-estimate that there may be some difficulties in this respect since you are clearly handling a large demand not only for English crowns but probably other countries as well. My Chief Cashier has, however, asked if he could have some details of when the coins will be despatched and how they will be sent so that he can co-ordinate arrangements with his fellow Chief Cashiers in local clearing banks.

Further to our telephone conversation this morning the samples of the unc coin arrived in the post. I am pleased to say that we found the quality admirable and would be happy if you would proceed to the production stage.

As I mentioned in my later telephone conversation with Mr. Lee we would now like to order 150,000 coins as our first tranche. This is an increase on our previous forecast but has been influenced by the requirements just received of the Bailiff's Silver Jubilee Committee and a local tobacco importer who between them have placed firm orders for at least 32,500 coins already. You mentioned in an earlier letter that production of unc coins was fairly rapid and I should be grateful if you would confirm that deliveries can be commenced before the end of March. This is because the local tobacco importer requires his coins by the end of that month.

I have been in contact with the Production Controller of Remploy Limited, and confirmed the order for the cardboard shells and slides; I am informed that no problems are foreseen in supplying the necessary 10,000 to the Royal Mint at Llantrisant by the end of March as you request, whilst Mr. M. Ableson of Sandhill Regd., and the Sales Director of the firm manufacturing the plastic capsules have both informed me that they will have their supplies to you by the 31st March.

With regard to the sale price of the coin mentioned in Mr. Lotherington's letter of 9th February, I confirm that the proof coin will be sold at £12.50 in Jersey and there is no objection to the Royal Mint selling the cupro-nickel unc version of the Jersey crown at $27\frac{1}{2}p$ per coin for its sales made outside the Island. I further agree with the Royal Mint recommendation that no limit be announced for the unc crowns and that adequate notice will be given of any re-minting of these coins required later in the year.

In connection with the financial aspects of the coin issue, I am pleased to confirm that your arrangements are acceptable, i.e. that you will invoice at cost the States Treasurer with the coins struck for sale within this Island whilst remitting at quarterly intervals a statement of the sales which you carried out from London deducting the production costs from your remittance.

It is good to hear that you are back in 'circulation' so to speak, and trust you are fully recovered from your recent illness.



You enquired at last Thursday's Production Progress meeting whether Jersey required their proof coins (domestic supplies) to be boxed up in any special way.

My memo of 12 January to Mr. Smith (copied to you) dealt with this subject. There you will see in paragraph 2 that we intended to make use of the R.M. standard fibre box for the proof coins, although it will not take 150 coins as Jersey's presentation case is an odd size.

I shall be grateful if you will recommend a method of pack based on this information. The only additional advice I can give you at this stage is that the Jersey presentation case measures 3.3" x 2.5". The depth is, I believe, the same as our case.

I repeat that Jersey are arranging for capsules, cases and shells and slides to be delivered to Llantrisant in March.



Dear Mr. Lotherington,

I was very sorry to hear of Mr. Hart's illness and in the circumstances felt I should, therefore, reply to his letter of the 12th January through you.

With regard to paragraph 1, I am quite agreeable to the initial manufacturing batch for the proof silver crowns being of at least 15,000 pieces and confirm that it is our wish to have the 10,000 proof coins for distribution in Jersey struck and delivered all in one consignment. In view of the short delivery period for cupro-nickel coins mentioned in paragraph 2 we shall require an initial batch of 50,000 coins. Following my conversation with Mr. Watkin today I do not anticipate any consignment problems arising from our presentation case for the proof crowns differing slightly in size from that which will be used by the Royal Mint. The Jersey presentation case will be oblong, measuring 3.3 inches by 2.5 inches and, therefore, this latter measurement will fit neatly into the 15 inch dimension of the packing case but certain additional packing will be required on the 18 inch dimension since only five boxes will be able to be packed along that length. I am grateful for your offer to contact your suppliers of the cardboard shells and slides which protect the presentation cases from accidental damage during transit and look forward to learning the quotation for supplying 25,000.

We should like to incorporate on the inside of the lid of the Jersey presentation case, the Royal Mint crest (this has been the practice in all previous presentation cases for proof coins struck by you for Jersey).

The manufacturer of the Jersey presentation case is Sandhill (Regd.) of Sandhill House, Templar Place, Leeds, LS2 7NX and Mr. M. Ableson has asked me to obtain your formal approval to the use of the Royal Mint crest. To simplify administration may I suggest you write directly to Mr. Ableson at Sandhill and confirm that Jersey can use the crest in this manner.

With reference to paragraph 7 and the comments concerning the capsule into which we would wish the proof coins to be placed, I did discuss the points raised (a and b) with the manufacturer before the order was placed. This particular type of capsule is in fact used by several companies specializing in the production of high quality proof coins and has been used with complete satisfaction for a number of years. I therefore thank you for your consideration of these issues and pointing them out at this early stage, but I feel we will have no worries on these particular scores.

If the opportunity arises I should be grateful if you would pass to Mr. Hart the best wishes of both the Treasurer and myself for an early recovery.



We spoke recently about outer packaging for those coins which are to be despatched to the various Monetary Authorities (as opposed to R.M./Bureaux sales) and your concern that an adequate number of boxes are available.

So far as I am aware all the proof coins will be sub-contracted to B.M.P; the cupro-nickel Uncs or ordinary standard pieces (whichever you choose to call them) will be struck at R.M./Llantrisant.

You should please allow for the following quantities to be sent to the listed countries. They are firm figures except for Jersey where the numbers shown are maximum requirements although I rather think they will take them all.

1. We have informed Jersey of our reservations regarding the use of their pill-box type primary pack but they appear to have received advice and recommendations from other quarters (Sandhill I believe) regarding the suitability of the pack for proof coin and, inspite of our advice, intend to proceed and accept the risks of damage to coin during assembly.

They say it has already been checked for chemical compatibility and been cleared.

2. They are arranging for the capsules and their presentation cases to be delivered to R.M./Llantrisant towards the end of March and, having assembled the coin in the capsule we are required to insert the capsule in the well of the presentation case. We then need to pack in our standard fibre box used for proof coin but whether it will hold the usual 150 pieces remains to be seen as the Jersey presentation case is I believe slightly rectangular.

All this will of course take place at B.M.P. assuming proofs are sub-contracted to them and it was agreed some weeks ago that the Product Specification office would provide a complete packing specification to go to B.M.P. with contract documents.

3. I have recommended to Jersey that their presentation cases should be protected by a cardboard shell and slide. It is not yet clear whether they have ordered these or whether we are required to provide them when we know the dimensions of their presentation case. I will keep you informed.

SILVER JUBILEE CROWN

I am sorry for the delay in replying to your letter of 24 December but the holiday intervened and there were some facts to collect.

- 1. The first point to be dealt with is the number of proof coins to be sent to Jersey initially. Our previous mention of an initial manufacturing batch size of 10,000 proofs was to allow for your initial requirements plus some for our bureaux sales. What we need to know is the actual number of proofs you require in the first consignment to meet local demand. If in fact the number is 10,000 we shall need to increase the initial manufacturing batch size to say 15,000 pieces. Once the initial manufacturing batch size is fixed, with an allowance for yourselves, we cannot promise delivery of further quantities at short notice and it may well be 4 to 8 weeks before we could supply additional proof coins. The point to be made it that it will be better to over-state your initial requirements than to understate them.
- 2. The cupro-nickel ordinary standard coins are far less of a problem and although it would be uneconomical to set up a press to strike small quantities, a batch of say 20,000 to 50,000 coins would be available for despatch within a week or two weeks at the outside from receipt of your instructions.
- 3. The cupro-nickel ordinary standard coins will be packed in rolls of 20 with 10 rolls to a carton and 10 cartons to a wooden box measuring 19½ x 9 x 8 v. Thus one wooden box measuring approximately 50cm x 23cm x 20cm will contain 2,000 coins.
- 4. Proof coins are packed in a different box size measuring 18" x 15" x 12" (46cm x 38cm x 30cm approximately). These boxes normally contain 150 crown size proof coins packed in their individual presentation cases each protected by a cardboard shell and slide. However, this is based on our standard size presentation case which measures 3" x 3" but I believe you have ordered a slightly rectangular case the dimensions of which I do not know. It might be that our outer container will only take 100 to 125 proof coins packed in your presentation case. We shall have to wait and see.



Another point which I mentioned to Mr. Clennett recently is the provision of individual cardboard shells and slides which protect the presentation cases from accidental damage. We recommend the use of these but as we do not know the size of your presentation case we cannot at present order for you. Either you can order direct or if you send us a presentation case we will arrange it.

The supplier requires about 6 weeks for delivery and we obtain ours from:

Remploy, Bloomfield Road, Blackwood, Gwent, Wales.

6. The plastic capsules and presentation cases you are supplying should please be delivered to:

Royal Mint, Llantrisant, Pontyclun, Glamorgan, CF7 8YT.

We shall require them by the end of March latest if not before.

7. This brings me to one other matter I have to draw to your attention with regard to packaging of proof coins.

As you perhaps know we normally enclose our proof coins in a thin transparent inert plastic envelope which is heat sealed. It is a transit pack only and is slipped inside the presentation case.

To enjoy the true beauty of the coin we recommend to the purchaser that he removes the coin from the transit envelope and places the naked coin in the well of the case. A fairly recent alternative which we strongly favour is a transparent rigid plastic screw-top capsule which protects the coin and sits in the well of the case as a permanent housing for the coin.

Our Factory subjected your capsule to suitability tests and I have to tell you that we are somewhat fearful of using it on two counts.

- a. We have not checked chemical compatibility and must absolve the Royal Mint from any coin discolouration problems arising from use of the capsule.
- b. The brilliant finish of a proof coin is very easily scratched by contact with any roughish material or sharp object and all coins are handled with great care to avoid accidential damage of this kind. We consider there is a real possibility that coins will suffer just this type of damage from contact with the relatively sharp edge of the capsule as the coin is assembled and we think it only right to warn you of this possibility. We shall obviously take every care to avoid accidental scratching but to us the capsule is an unfamiliar,

untried primary pack and from our point of view you are taking a risk. I do not wish to alarm you or imply that you will receive scratched coins. On the contrary I hope you will be entirely satisfied with the end result but we have had no experience of using the Algram capsule and feel you should be aware of our doubts.
